Arizona Christmas Shoe Box Ministry

We will be collecting Christmas shoe boxes for the Arizona mission points again this year.

Please purchase a plastic shoe box from Walmart or Dollar General Store in which to place your items. We do ask that you put colored tissue paper inside to cover the items or you wrap the boxes, top and bottom separately so that it is more like a Christmas gift.

Please affix the prepared labels on the end of the box which indicates the age level of your box. The labels are available at the association office or on our website.

We ask you to **include a gift of \$4.00 to help cover shipping**. This should be either placed in an envelope in the box or a church can send a check to cover the expenses.

Associational Information

Missions

The church of Jesus Christ was never meant to be an institution that we just attend, but a movement we are a part of. Over the years that has been forgotten by many believers. Currently, our church is studying through the book of Acts. Something that became very apparent early in the study is that Jesus gives His mission in Acts 1:8, well before the church is established in Acts 2. So, Jesus didnøt simply give a mission to His church, but He gave a church to His mission. In fact, if a local church isnøt involved in His mission the question then becomes, õis it truly His church?ö Let me offer some practical ways your church can get engaged in missions regardless of the size.

- #1. Pray! Plead with the Lord to burden believers in your local church to live on mission for Christ. Until we each realize that individually we are commissioned by Christ, we will not partner with other believers in missions. When you study Acts you pick up very quickly how connected prayer is to being empowered by the Spirit with boldness to engage people with the gospel.
- #2. Participate in the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering. This is the first special offering this year. Every penny that your members give goes toward mission endeavors and church planting in North America. Your giving will support 2900 missionary families.
- #3. Plan simple ways for your church to adopt an Acts 1:8 strategy. Think about how your church can uniquely fulfill Godøs mission locally, regionally, and impact the uttermost. For your Jerusalem and Judea emphasis develop a local mission partnership with a pregnancy care center, a youth camp, a senior citizens center, or a nursing home. There are plenty of ways to partner locally if we take the time to look. In your Samaria emphasis pray about going on a vision tour with the North American Mission Board so that your church can connect personally with a church planter in an area that desperately needs the gospel. Connecting with missions on the other side of the world seems unrealistic. However, did you know that your church can contact the International Mission Board and personally connect with a missionary serving overseas? You can personally pray for their family and their needs even if you canøt go to the other side of the world personally. Email info@imb.org to see how you can connect.

As an association of churches, we can also partner together in unique ways to accomplish Jesusømission. Be in prayer as our association searches for a new Association Mission Strategist to lead us in these ways. But donøt neglect being on mission for Christ right now. Jesus is worthy. Letøs make Him known in the world.
