Associational Information

Greetings from the ORBA DOM/AMS Search Team Committee.

It's been a long process, and we have had some excellent candidates to choose from in our search for the new Association Mission Strategist for our Association.

We have conducted several interviews via ZOOM meetings and after much prayer, we believe that the Lord has narrowed the field to one final candidate. We are not prepared to name the candidate at this time, as he still has some contacts that he needs to notify that he is considering a transition in his ministry. However, he, and we as a committee have agreed that this can be accomplished by the first of May. Therefore, we have scheduled a visit to our area for the candidate and his family the first weekend in May. He will be arriving the evening of May 2nd. Members of the team will be meeting with he and his family the morning of Friday, May 3rd. We will spend the day touring our two-county area and conducting in-person interviews.

Friday evening, May 3rd, we will be introducing the candidate and his family to the Association in a revival type service at North Livingston Baptist Church, 967 Carrsville Rd, Hampton, Ky. He will be speaking and sharing about his testimony and his vision for our Association moving forward. We will have a pot blessing dessert fellowship following the service. This is an informal meet and greet social to provide membership an opportunity to meet the candidate and his family.

Saturday morning, May 4th, 8:30AM, at the Associational Office in Salem, we are hosting an Executive Board meeting/brunch (brunch will be provided). The purpose of this meeting is to offer a forum to ask the more serious questions that you or your members may have of the candidate. We urge all Executive Board members and those of your churches that may wish to attend to come prepared to ask and learn about this brother and his leadership abilities.

We have asked as a committee, that the Association, at the Semi-Annual meeting, April 15, 2024, vote to go ahead and schedule a special called meeting for the purpose of voting on this candidate, Monday, May 6, 7PM, at the Associational office in Salem. This was approved. The officers of the executive board in accordance to the By-Laws have added the following to the purpose of the special called meeting: "and any other issues directly related to the call of the new AMS." The By-Laws of the Association requires the churches be notified at least 10 days prior to any special called meeting, thus we felt it necessary to go forward with this meeting. We urge you to be aware that a quorum is necessary to conduct the business of the Association, so please announce this meeting and make sure your messengers are present.
