#### On the Trail with Happy Trails Ministry

Our 21st year of equestrian ministry is in the history books and year #22 has just begun! We finished out an exciting 2024 with 2 horse show cowboy church events, co-sponsored 2 Paul Daily Horse Whisperer events, spoke in 2 churches about our equestrian ministry, and shared our horseback faith presentation (with my equine partner, "Chip") at 6 churches and 2 Christian schools... what a blessing! One report I filled out recently wanted me to estimate the number of people that were impacted by our ministry. When I put the pencil to our calendar of events, it revealed that we impacted an estimated 1,600 people with the good news of Jesus Christ at these events. Praise God for each opportunity!

At the time of this writing (December 17), it appears that we are going to have our best year ever at Kentucky Lake Cowboy Church... another huge blessing! Our November average attendance was 93; with 2 Sundays remaining, our December average is 99. Our previous highest yearly average attendance was 86; this was in 2019 (Pre-Covid). We averaged 80 for the year in both 2022 and 2023. This year we are averaging 91 for the year. Best of all, we have baptized 7 precious souls this year while adding a total of 17 new members... Praise God!!

We appreciate the continued prayerful support of our ORBA friends as we continue to follow God's call to share the love of Jesus in the equestrian community! I can't wait to hear news of even more growth in the Retriever Hunt Test Ministry in 2025! Please continue to remember Tim and Joyce Burdon as God opens new and exciting doors for this unique ministry.
