A Word From Bro. Mark

I was privileged to participate in an "International Mission Board Virtual Conference" on February 13th. The conference included a session by Mark Clifton on "Revitalizing a Dving Church". Mark said....."There are more Baptist Churches in North America than there are McDonalds, Starbucks, and Waffle Houses combined, and yet over 50% of these churches will have less than 50 people on any Sunday. Our priority must be to win people to Christ." Ed Stetzer led a session on "The State of the Church in 2025". Ed said...."For the past 30 years, the rise of those who claim no religious affiliation and those who do not identify with Christianity has increased 1% every year, until 2020. Six things have changed since then; more Gen Z men (those born in the late 1990's to early 2000's) are attending church than women; teens are more spiritually open to the gospel; the rise of those with no religious affiliation has plateaued; large churches have become even larger; and there's been a substantial increase in Bible sales. How do we respond to these changes? We should be encouraged about the future of the church. This is our time of opportunity to reach people for Christ. Disrupted times (like we're experiencing today) lead to spiritual opportunity." I completely agree with Ed Stetzer when I look at the future of our association. I believe we must make it our priority to fulfill the mandate Jesus gave us in Matthew 28: 19-20 to go and reach people for Christ. We now have copies of the NAMB gospel trac, "Eternal Life". I hope you will pick up a pack of these trac's and use them. I am looking forward to attending the "REACH Evangelism & Missions Conference" at First Baptist Church, Somerset, KY on March 10th – 11th. I hope our pastors and board members will plan to be at the next Executive Board Meeting at the associational office, March 17th. The fellowship meal is at 6:15pm and the meeting is at 7:00pm.

Help us promote to your church the "Disaster Relief Training" on March 22nd at Southside Baptist Church, Princeton. The training will begin at 8:30am and end at 4:00pm. This training is for anyone who is interested in being a Disaster Relief Volunteer.

I am excited about the opportunity we have as an association to connect with the mission work going on in Cincinnati, Ohio. Millions of people in Cincinnati are without Christ. Only 13% are affiliated with any church. There's only one Southern Baptist Church for every 10,298 Cincinnatians, so there is a great need for planting new churches. Please pray for Bro. Andrew Sexton as he goes to the "Catch the Vision Tour" in Cincinnati April 28-29. I know he will return with a lot of information to help us know how we can be a part of what God's doing in Cincinnati.


I appreciate more than you'll ever know your prayers and support for Debbie and I as we continue the mission and ministry of ORBA.
